Perfect Passive Participles - ARTCCCCC Translations

Participles are VERBAL ADJECTIVES and agree with the modified noun in case, number, & gender.

Subject PPP

Main verb

Coquus vocātus ab omnibus laudātus est.

- Adjectival descriptive of the noun The cook HAVING BEEN CALLED was praised by everyone (gives reader/listener information & moves narrative along Effect:
- Relative relates dependent clause to main idea The cook, WHO had been called, was praised by all. (emphasizes or calls attention to the noun antecedent) Effect:
- Temporal sequence of time/events The cook, AFTER he had been called, was praised by all (Adverb – deinde = then, may appear in the main clause) Effect:
- **Causal** gives a reason The cook, **BECAUSE**/since he had been called, was praised by all. (tells why the action of the 2nd verb occurs) Effect:
- Collative puts 2 ideas together (=) The cook was summoned AND praised by all (<u>only</u> when PPP describes the subject of main clause; makes both actions equal & moves narrative along) Effect:
- Circumstantial describes the situation The cook, WHEN he was called, was praised by all. Effect: (esp. when emphasizing customs, traditions, habits, or repetitive actions
- Conditional states what needs to exist The cook, IF he had been called, was praised by all. (Adverbs - tum, tunc = then, may appear in the main clause) Effect:
- **Concessive states direct contrast to the main idea-The cook ALTHOUGHI even though! though he had been called, was praised by all. (Adverb – tamen = nevertheless, may appear in the main clause) Effect: ** Used least frequently

Active Passive

(No active) 4th principal part of TRANSITIVE verbs (-tus -a -um/ -sus, -a um)

audītus -- a- um -- having been heard, listened to amātus -a -um - having been loved positus -- a -- um -- having been placed latus -a -um - having been brought, borne, carried, worn factus -a -um - having been made, done habitus -a -um / vīsus -a -um - having been held/having been seen
